AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE POSITION OF POLICE CHIEF AND POLICE OFFICERS OF THE CITY OF HUNTERS HOLLOW, BULLITT COUNTY, KENTUCKY FIXING THEIR QUALIFICATIONS, TENURE, AND COMPENSATION.

John MISSIONEYS Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the City of Hunters Hollow, Bullitt County, Kentucky, as follows:

SECTION ONE: Duties of Police Chief:

The Police Chief shall be responsible for:

Planning, directing, and exercising general supervision over the work of the police department.

Formulating and enforcing rules and regulations, work methods, and procedures.

3. Making and reviewing all personnel assignments within the Department.

Reviewing activities and reports of officers.

Commission Making recommendations to the Chairman and Board of Trustees for the appointment, promotion, and dismissal of officers.

6. Enforcing disciplinary measures when necessary.

7. Ascertaining that officers receive adequate training in modern police methods and procedures.

Directing the preparation and maintenance of police records and files.

Directing the investigation of major criminal offenses.

Cooperating with State and Federal Officers in the apprehension of wanted persons.

-ommissioners 11. Seeing that reports are prepared for the Board of Trustees, National Security Council, and Federal Bureau of Investigation.

12. Meeting with and answering questions for the public.

Attending police conferences and meeting with various citizens' groups.

Duties: The duties of a police officer shall be as follows:

1. Patrolling a designated area of the City in a patrol car to prevent and discover the commission of crime and to enforce traffic regulations; answer calls and complaints; administer first aid; serve warrants; and answer questions for the public.

2. Conducting preliminary investigations at the scene of crimes and serious accidents; gathers evidence; locates and interviews witnesses; makes arrest and interrogates prisoners;

compiles accident statistics.

Directing traffic at intersections and at accidents and fires; maintains order in crowds, at parades, and other public meetings.

Operating electronic equipment for speed detection. Preparing and maintaining necessary records and reports.

Participating in training activities.

Giving advice on laws and ordinances and general information to the public.

SECTION TWO: Qualifications -

The applicant for Chief of Police shall have graduated from high school or have a high school equivalency.

The applicant for Police Officer shall meet the guidelines established by the Board of Trustees in its rules and regulations

Commissioner

of the City Police Department which have previously been adopted.
All applicants for these positions shall be over the age of twenty-one (21) years.

SECTION THREE: Tenure:

These positions shall exist until the first Monday in January, 1984 or until a successor is duly appointed and qualified. SECTION FOUR: Compensation:

No rate of compensation shall be paid for the services of the police chief.

No rate of compensation shall be paid for the services of the police officer.

SECTION FIVE: Effective Date:

This Ordinance shall become effective upon first reading, approval, and publication.

SECTION SIX: All ordinances, or parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance or any part of this Ordinance are repealed.

SECTION SEVEN: Should any section, clause, line, paragraph, or part of this Ordinance be held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the same shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance.
